Fellow Lions,

Lion Treasurer John Warren has invited Inspector Andrea Higgens from the San Mateo County District Attorney's Office Elder Abuse Unit and Nicole Fernandez from the Elder & Dependent Adult Protection Team to speak to our members. Their discussion will include financial abuse prevention, recognizing scams, personal safety for seniors, and a Power Point presentation.

According to the National Incidence Study on Elder Abuse, approximately 450,000 elderly experienced abuse in 1996 nationwide. If self-neglect is included, the number is 551,000.

The personal losses associated with abuse can be devastating and include the loss of independence, homes, life savings, health, dignity, and security. Victims of abuse have been shown to have shorter expectancies than non-abused older people as well. Please plan on joining us at this meeting.




